Byers, of whose tireless and devoted pastoral ministry in this place we were reminded by the wonderful surprise of his widow, Mary Ann's presence at the 10:00 Eucharist last Sunday.) One of the first jobs of this committee will be to develop a questionnaire which will be seeking the feelings of all the members of our parish family about what makes St. John's the special place it is for each of us; what hopes and dreams we have for its futures; and what skills and personal traits we would be looking for in a pastor who will be leading us into the future we envision. In advance of your receipt of the questionnaire, however, I would ask each of you to think about these things, asking yourself particularly what it was that led you to the Church of St. John in the Wilderness in the first place, and what keeps you here. It is the answer to these questions that makes a church "come alive" in the parish profile we will eventually publish, and aids a potential candidate for rector, in deciding if this is the place that God might be calling him or her to. Pray for the Search Committee, and pray for Lucy, its chair. The fruits of its efforts can be the key to the future of our beloved church.

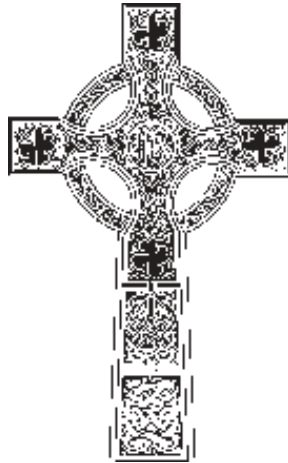
